Big News! The Chaffee Park has received a KaBOOM grant and new playground equipment will be installed on October 22. On Build Day, there will be 140 volunteers from Home Depot, the funding partner, and 75 volunteers from the community. With the 235+ volunteers we will build the playground in one day!

Design Day was in September and over 50 people from the community attended. Thank you to all who participated and a special thanks to all our young playground designers who presented their great ideas. Since the Design Day, the Playworld Systems playground designers have created three options, the votes have been cast and design #1 is the winner. Founded twenty years previously by Jim Sannino and his three sons — Anthony, Jimmy and Johnny, it was originally located just down the street at 44th and Lowell. The Sannino brothers relocated to Wheat Ridge over the summer and sold this neighborhood landmark to Larimer Associates. These business partners are responsible for notable, new North Denver neighborhood establishments, Billy's Inn and LoHi SteakBar.

Slated to open in mid-November, the new Ernie's Bar & Pizza will pay homage to the original name of location — Ernie's Supper Club, run by none other than Ernie Capolupo



himself for more than 30 years. Even the neon 3 Sons blade sign will be reverted back to its original creation, aglow with the Ernie's name once again.

This fun, neighborhood-style bar and pizzeria plans to feature thin-crust, New York style pizza made with the highest quality ingredients, bar-friendly appetizers, a wide array of attractively priced antipasti and fresh gelato. The menu will be created by no other than former New Yorker and beloved Denver chef, Sean Kelly, known for his tenure at successful restaurants Aubergine, Clair de Lune and Somethin' Else.

Wanting to stay true to the neighborhood, the new owners hope to create a community institution where you can shoot some pool, lounge in front of the fireplace, watch your favorite football game on one of the many flatscreen televisions, and take in any one of the 30 or more American draft beers — available by pitcher, of course. And true to Denver standards, there will be a sizeable patio on the east and



south sides of the building that in the summer are sure to be the most coveted seats in the house.

Whether your evening is about bellying up to the bar and making new friends or bringing in the family for pizza and gelato, Ernie's looks to continue the infamy and notoriety that has filled this Sunnyside building for so many decades. ## Recycler's Corner

### 2009 LEAFDROP: RAKE, REUSE & RECYCLE

*It's time once again to rake up and recycle the leaves in your yard and help make sure that they are turned into compost!*

On the first three Sundays in November (Nov. 1, 8 & 15), residents may drop off an unlimited amount of leaves at five LeafDrop locations. Two weekday drop-off locations will also be available from October 5th through December 4th. LeafDrop is brought to you by Denver Recycles, a program of Solid Waste Management/Denver Public Works.

Removing yard debris, such as leaves, from our waste stream is important in reducing our impact on global warming and the environment. Consider recycling your leaves by digging them into your garden, composting them at home or using a lawn mower to mulch small amounts into your grass. Using your fallen leaves in this manner can help you create a healthy lawn or garden!

- Denver residents only.
- Never sweep your leaves into the street. This clogs up storm sewers and street sweeper vehicles.
- Make sure your leaves do not contain branches or waste.
- DO NOT drop leaves at these sites except during the times and dates specified.

- Don't forget to treat your Halloween jack-o-lanterns to a second chance and compost them with Denver LeafDrop.

Weekday LeafDrops must be in tied or secured bags. Paper bags are preferred.

#### BROWN BAG THEM & GO!

Save your plastic trash bags and our time by bringing your leaves in paper yard debris bags. Unlike plastic bags, brown paper bags can be composted with your leaves. Many hardware, home improvement and department stores sell paper yard debris bags. Or even better, bring your leaves in reusable containers or tarps that we can empty and give back to you.

Close the Loop by reclaiming your leaves next spring in the form of rich compost at the 2010 Treecycle Mulch Giveaway & LeafDrop Compost Sale. After April 1, 2010, you may call 720-865-6810 or visit DenverGov.org/DenverRecycles for details.
